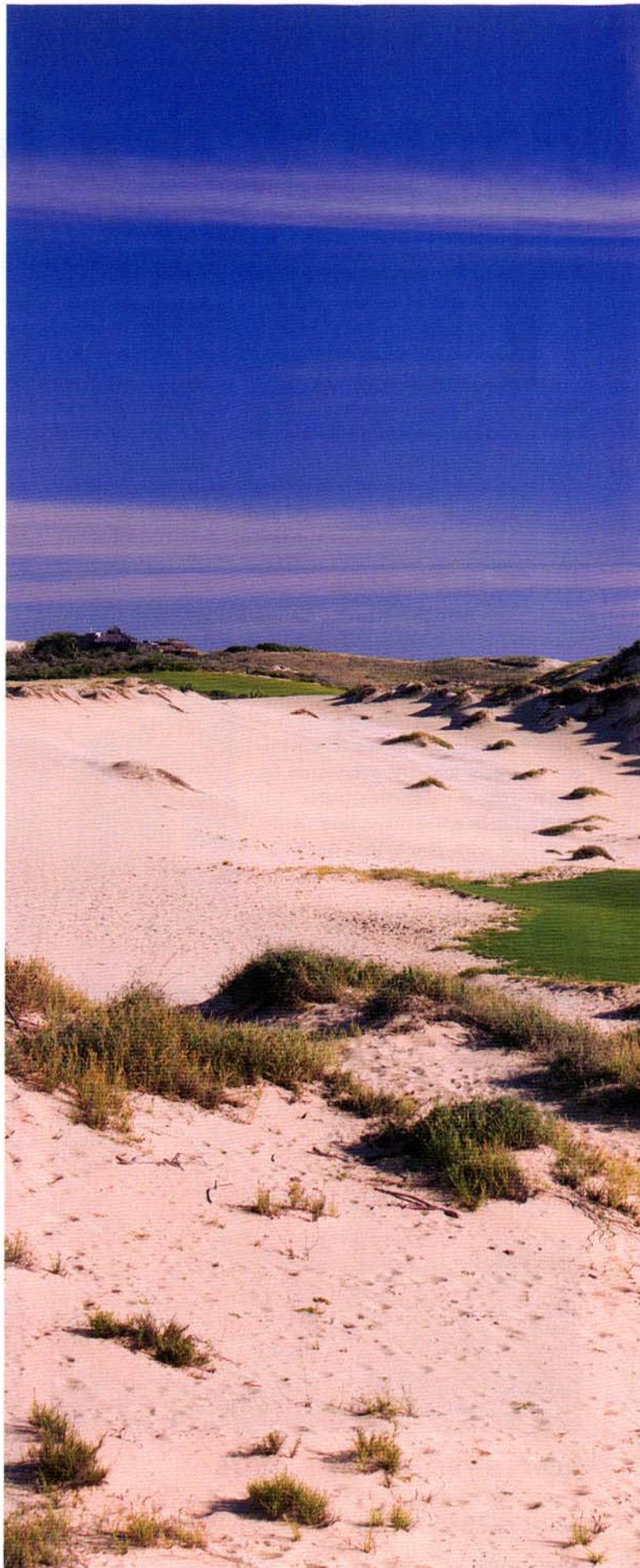

Winding through a variety of trees, wildflowers and native grasses, Tim Cate's design is the centerpiece of the 4,500-acre Brunswick Forest community, located 10 minutes from Wilmington, North Carolina. Unlike most of the real estate courses in the area, Cape Fear National will be open to the public.

Fittingly, Tom Doak's creation along the Sea of Cortez in Baja California, Mexico, is as ethereal as the name ("Bay of Dreams") indicates. Now open to preview play for property owners, prospects and resort guests, Doak's desert-meets-sea layout climbs, falls and rolls over varied terrain of hills, dunes and beach—with views of the sea throughout.
